

Disc Jockey's 2-Hour Appeal Gets Him Raise

A disc jockey for a Prince Georges County radio station got a pay raise today by locking himself in the studio and broadcasting his personal difficulties for two hours.

Larry Justice, a 28-year-old announcer for station WPGC, went on the air this morning at 9:45 o'clock, locked himself in the control room and launched his pay-raise campaign by playing—incessantly—a record called "President Kennedy's Press Conference."

Station officials engaged in a certain amount of discussion with him, and finally announced to the press that his pay was raised.

Reporters suspected the entire affair may have been a publicity stunt. Prince Georges County police went to the station to see if any law was being violated.

Although Mr. Justice seemed angry with his employers, he did not neglect to put the scheduled commercials on the air.
